

Lower Kennebec River:

With the humidity and the air temperatures dropping over the last few weeks, fall seems to be inching closer. Since the last report, flow conditions in the lower Kennebec River ranged between 3,470 cfs and 9,570 cfs. The current flow conditions of 5,530 cfs falls between the mean (5,250 cfs) and the 75th% (6,200 cfs) (<https://waterdata.usgs.gov>, based on 38 years of data).

Lockwood fish lift, located in Waterville, ME at the first dam on the mainstem Kennebec River, opened on May 1st for the 2024 season. The first Atlantic salmon of the season showed up on 5/23. Forty-six new Atlantic salmon have been captured to date this season; one new salmon have arrived since the last report. The fish lift shut down for maintenance since 8/6-8/19.

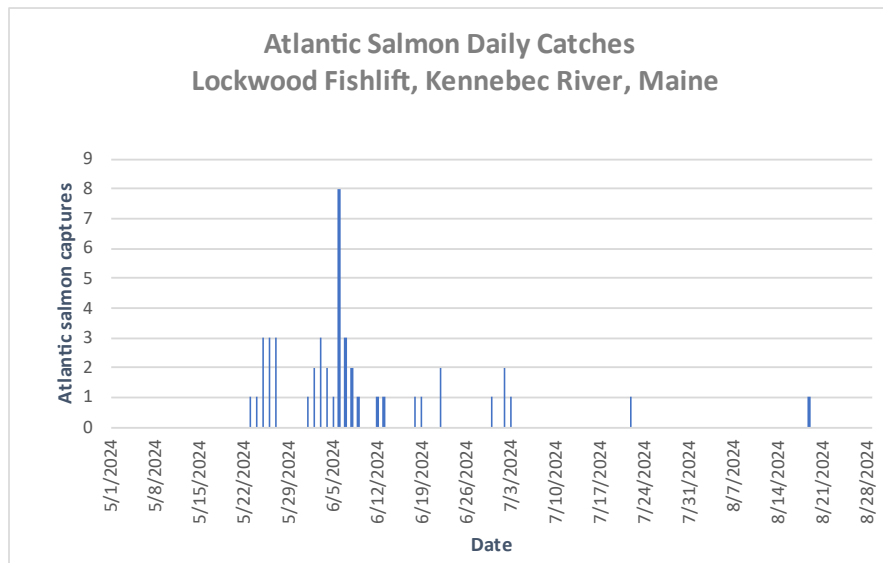


Figure 1: Daily Atlantic salmon catch at Lockwood fish lift, Waterville, ME. Daily catches for 8/15 - 8/29 is averaging 0.07 salmon/day. The trap opened on 5/1 and has been operating daily until 8/6 when it was shut down for maintenance for two weeks.

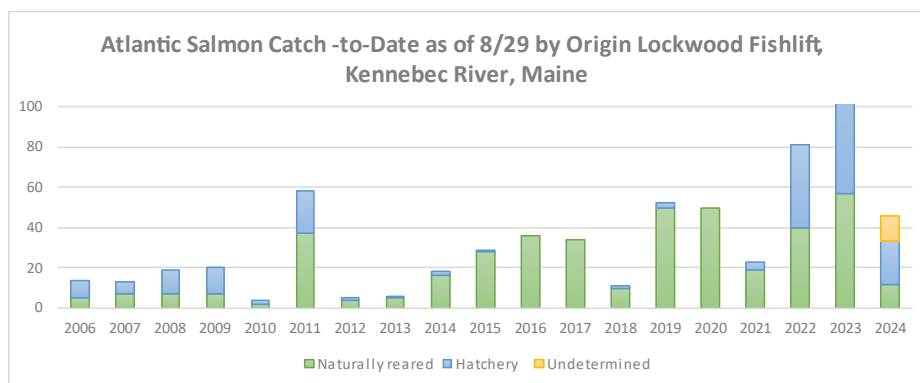


Figure 2: Atlantic salmon catch-to-date for each year by origin since Lockwood fish lift (Waterville, ME) has been operational (2006)

Lockwood fish lift total catches for 2024:

- River herring: 86,467 captures*
- American shad: 23*
- Sea lamprey: 15*
- Striped bass: 60*
- Atlantic salmon: 45

Benton Falls fishway, the first fishway located on the Sebasticook River, a tributary to the Kennebec River, has been open since May 1st this year. Two Atlantic salmon have been caught to date. In addition, 3.2 million river herring passed into China Lake this season! The fishway is currently temporarily shut down for repairs.

Benton Falls fishway total catches for 2024 as of 6/24:

- River herring: 6,551,356
- American shad: 5
- Atlantic salmon: 2
- Sea lamprey: 172
- Striped bass: 0

Lower Mainstem Androscoggin River:

Brunswick fishway, located in Brunswick, ME on the mainstem Androscoggin River, has been open since May 1st this year. The river discharge level in the lower Androscoggin River ranged between 3,530 cfs and 6,580 cfs since the last report on 8/14. Currently, the river discharge is at 4,080 cfs, which falls between the 75th% (3,770 cfs) and the high (38,800 cfs) discharge level recorded (<https://waterdata.usgs.gov>, based on 95 years of data). Seventeen Atlantic salmon have been captured to date this season; no new captures this week. The first two salmon passed on 5/23.

- River herring: 112,563
- American shad: 91
- Sea lamprey: 734
- Atlantic salmon: 17
- Striped bass: 3
