Information for Applicants

The Atlantic Salmon Federation (ASF) offers Fellowship up to \$3,000 to residents seeking to improve their knowledge or skills in salmon-related fields with the goal of finding solutions to current problems in Atlantic salmon biology, management or conservation.

The Fellowship may be applied toward a wide range of endeavors including salmon management, graduate study and research. Applicants do not need to be enrolled in a degree program.

In applying for an ASF Fellowship, we recommend you observe the following guidelines:

- 1. Ensure all attachments are included with your application:
 - statement of your qualifications
 - transcript of grades, if applicable
 - description of the program/project for which you are seeking the Fellowship
 - supporting documentation, if required
- 2. Make certain that your project description contains complete and concise information on all the points listed in Item 6, Page 2, of the application form. Applications are judged largely on the information contained in this section.
- 3. Email your application to emansfield@asf.ca by October 31st. Applicants will be advised of awards by January 15thth.
